Sunday 7th. Postgate Rally at Ugthorpe. (See more on p.3)



Sea Sunday. 14th July 2024

Every year churches around the world celebrate Sea Sunday. It is a day for people to come together to pray for seafarers and fishers, and thank them for the vital role they play in all of our lives.

A labelled collection bag will be in the church foyer for your donations of warm coats, hats, balaclavas, gloves and mittens, rosaries, toiletries and bars of chocolate for distribution



by the Stella Maris team. However, much of the work that Stella Maris carries out relies on donations of money. You can read about the wide range of support that Stella Maris gives to seafarers on their website www.stellamaris.org.uk. You can make donations of money through their website or text 'SEA' to 70460 to donate £5.

Today's seafarer is no longer in port for a few nights, but often only for a few hours. In these changed circumstances Apostleship of the Sea adapted to provide pro-active outreach by way of ship visiting to assess practical needs, backed up by a modern drop-in centre inside the docks, equipped with email terminals and telephones to facilitate contact with loved ones back home whom they may not have seen for nine or even twelve months.

In October 1920 in Glasgow Apostleship of the Sea (now known as Stella Maris) was established to support seafarers in need. 100 years later we are the largest ship-visiting network in the world, providing seafarers with practical and pastoral support, information, and a friend in times of need.


Blessed Nicholas was one of 85 martyrs beatified by Pope John Paul II in 1987. Born in Egton in 1596, he trained for the priesthood in France before returning to Yorkshire.

He was martyred at York in 1679 as part of the anti-Catholic persecution in England at the time, and was one of the last Catholics in this country to be put to death for their faith. He became known as the "Martyr of the Moors".

This year, Dr Emma Morrison (from St Paulinus Parish) plans to resurrect the Walk for Vocations ahead of the rally. The walk, from Whitby to Ugthorpe, is 12.7km (7.9miles) on a variety of terrain include forest tracks and fields. Please ensure you wear sturdy footwear and all members of your party are fit enough to walk this distance. Bring your own packed lunch. Under-18s must be accompanied by a parent or guardian and the terrain is not suitable for wheelchairs or buggies. Walkers are asked to meet at Whitby Abbey car park at 11am.


A message for all Ministers of the Word and of the Eucharist.



The Election QUESTIONS FOR YOUR CANDIDATES.

Many SVP members and CAFOD supporters have been involved in volunteering or campaigning for many years on issues such as poverty, food and climate. Here are some key issues to raise with your candidates whether that be via email, at a hustings or on the doorstep.

- 1. With almost two million people using foodbanks in the UK, the highest number on record, what are your plans to tackle the cost of living crisis in our area and nationally? If elected, would you commit to improve our social security system by raising the basic rate of Universal Credit so that people can meet their essential needs?
- 2. Every year, people tragically die as they attempt to cross borders to reach safety. If elected, will you champion the right to safe and legal routes for people needing to flee their

homes, rather than leave vulnerable people prey to people smugglers? If elected, will you ensure the country is a welcoming one to refugees and migrants, including ending the unjust deportation of people who haven't even had their asylum applications heard?

- 3. If elected, what will your party do to address regional inequalities and help communities thrive? Will you commit to working more closely with local groups and communities, including faith groups such as the St Vincent de Paul Society to identify the best policies to support left-behind areas?
- 4. Our overseas aid budget has not only been cut, but the Department for International Development has been shut down, and much of the remaining aid money has been redirected to domestic spending. Can you let me know what you will do to ensure Britain restores its aid budget and supports people across the world who are experiencing poverty?
